Emeritus Professor Steven Freeland (BCOM, LLB, LLM, PHD) is Emeritus Professor of International Law Western Sydney University and Professorial Fellow at Bond University. He has represented the Australian Government at United Nations Committee Meetings and has advised many Governments on issues related to the national and international regulation of space activities and the development of a national spaceindustry strategy. He has been appointed by UNCOPUOS to cochair its Working Group on Legal Aspects of Space Resource Activities, and by the Australian Government as a Member of the Advisory Board of the Australian Space Agency. Among other appointments, he is a Director of the Paris-based International Institute of Space Law and a member of the Space Law Committee of the International Law Association (ILA).



Donna Lawler (BA, LLB) is a Co-Founder and Principal at Azimuth Advisory, a member of the International Institute of Space Lawyers and a fellow of the London Institute of Space Policy and Law. She is an experienced commercial space lawyer specialising in complex transactions in the space and telecommunications industries. Over more than twenty years in the satellite industry she has been an advisor to Optus and SingTel on satellite related issues, and more recently, to a range of commercial space organisations, including launch facilities, launch service providers communications satellite operators, and operators of cubesat constellations. She has also practiced

technology and telecommunications law at Baker & McKenzie in Hong Kong and Minter Ellison in Sydney.

Professor Grzegorz Wrochna serves as the President of Polish Space Agency POLSA. Born in Poland. PhD in physics at University of Warsaw. 1986-1991 worked at the Faculty of Physics, University of Warsaw. 1991- 1998 he worked at CERN Geneva on Large Hadron Collider experiments. Since 1999 he worked at the Institute for Nuclear Studies, since 2006 as its director. In 2011 he initiated creation of the National Centre for Nuclear Research (NCBJ) and became its director. He represented Poland in EURATOM Program Committee, in Board of Governors of EU Joint Research Centre and several committees of OECD Nuclear Energy Agency. 2019-2020 served as undersecretary of state in the Ministry of Science and Higher Education. In 2021 appointed as the president of Polish Space Agency.



Andrzej Misztal in diplomatic service from 1992 to 2022. During his career, he served as Director of the Legal and Treaty Department, Legal Advisor of the Republic of Poland to the UN, and as the representative of the Republic of Poland to the Sixth Committee of the UN General Assembly. He was also Deputy Ambassador-Permanent Representative of Poland to the UN Office at Geneva. In addition, he represented Poland at the International Commission for the International Search Service (ITS) in Bad Arolsen From 2018 to 2020, he served as Chairman of the Legal Subcommittee of the UN Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space (COPUOS). He currently serves as chairman of the Space Resources Working Group (elected in June 2021). He is currently an independent expert. He specializes in public international law, including humanitarian, disarmament and space law.



Marta Kolibabska, Legal counsel, head of the Space Policy Department at the Department of Innovation and Industrial Policy of the Ministry of Development and Technology, responsible for shaping and coordinating space policy in Poland. Delegate to the Council of the European Space Agency and the Administrative and Financial Committee of the Agency, as well as a member of the Polish delegation to the meetings of the Subcommittees: Scientific, Technical, and Legal of COPUOS and the UN Commission on International Trade Law (UNCITRAL). Her professional interests focus on instruments of support for the Polish space sector, legal aspects of space activities, intellectual property law, and















international law in economic cooperation.
