UNIVERSITY OF WARSAW

University of Warsaw (UW) was established in 1816 as the Royal University of Warsaw, and the largest in Poland. From the beginning the University of Warsaw has played a major role in the intellectual, political, and cultural life of Poland. Dynamic political, social, and economic changes accompanying Poland's democratisation have brought the University new opportunities and challenges. Interest in studying at UW results above all from the University's prestige – something UW has earned through the high educational level it offers and the research work.

Today, UW provides educational services for over 54.000 students, 3.000 doctoral students, 7.000 postgraduate students, and employs over 6.200 employees. They are divided for over 20 faculties and more than 30 centers. The University is divided into 3 main campuses – in Ochota (Natural Sciences), Mokotów (Management, Linguistics, European Studies), and the Main Campus as well as a number of locations spread throughout the city centre (Sociology, International Relations, Economics). The Main Campus hosts inter alia the Faculty of Law and Administration and is rapidly expanding through the Powiśle District down to the Vistula River.

FACULTY OF LAW AND ADMINISTRATION



The Faculty of Law and Administration is one of the oldest faculties at the University of Warsaw. The School of Law and Administration was established in 1811 and was incorporated by the newly established Royal University of Warsaw and the Faculty of Law and Administration.

After liberation in 1918, Republic of Poland nourished colossal developments of the Polish statehood and University of Warsaw alike. The dynamic growth of the University and its Faculty of Law and Administration was stopped when the Secret Faculty Council took all necessary decisions, defined the functions of institutes and ran clandestine courses as most other faculties of the University of Warsaw. The University has renewed its activity in May 1945. In July 1945, the Faculty of Law started teaching activities as well.

IN THE PRESENT



There are about 6.000 students of 1st, 2nd and single cycle students, numerous postgraduate students as well as few hundreds of PhD students at the Faculty of Law and Administration. Educational services for law and administration students and number of postgraduate students are provided. These make the Faculty the largest Law Faculty in Poland.

OUR BUILDINGS

The Faculty is based in five buildings.

01

The first and the oldest, the Leon Petrazycki Building is our historical headquarter, named after the one of the most world-famous philosophers and lawyers. After major renovation in 2010, the Building hosts the Dean's Office, administration offices, seminar rooms, and four departments: the Department of Civil Law, the Department of History of Law, the Department of Jurisprudence, and the Department of Penal Law.

02

The Collegium Iuridicum II was opened in 1998. It hosts lecture rooms as well as a number of Schools of Foreign Law.

Further, in 2005 the Collegium Iuridicum III was opened. The Building hosts the Faculty Library and the Department of Legal and Administrative Theory.

In 2011 the Cezary Berezowski Building was opened and hosts the Department of International Law and guests rooms.

We also use some lecture and seminar rooms in the Building of Old Library and Auditorium Maximum. Student's Office is situated in d. CIUW Building.

ERASMUS+

The Faculty of Law and Administration maintains relations within the framework of Erasmus+ Programme with nearly

90 partner law faculties.

We continuously develop our international relations.

Every year we send abroad over 120 students, doctoral students and staff, and accept over 70 international ones. Moreover, we also provide some academic staff exchange. We also cooperate with some American, British, and German universities, and other institutions worldwide.

The academic year in Poland is traditionally divided into semesters.

THE WINTER SEMESTER

October 1st 2023 – February 18th 2024

The winter semester includes teaching from **October 2nd 2023** till **January 28th 2024**,

and allows for the following days off:

- November 1st – All Saints Day
- November 11th – the National Independence Day
- December 22nd 2023 – January 7th 2024 is the winter break for Christmas and the New Year

The winter semester's examination session runs from **January 29th till February 11th 2024**, and the winter semester's exam retake session starts on February 23rd 2024 and ends on March 3rd 2024.

The inter-semester break runs from **February 12th till February 18th 2024**.

THE SUMMER SEMESTER

February 19th 2024 – September 30th 2024

The summer semester includes teaching from **February 19th 2024** till **June 16th 2024**,

and allows for the following days off:

- March 28th – April 2nd – Easter break
- May 1st – Labour Day
- May 3rd – Constitution Day
- May 10th – May 11th – student festival days (Iuvenalia)
- May 30th – Corpus Christi

The summer semester's examination session runs from **June 17th to July 7th 2024**, and the summer semester's exam retake session starts on September 2nd 2024 and ends on September 15th 2024.
